# **DAWES COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION**

The Public convened meeting of the Dawes County Board of Equalization in regular session was commenced at the hour of 8:58 A.M. on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of January 2011 and published pursuant to public notice as required by law and or posted. The meeting was called to order by Commissioner Johnson. Roll was called and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioners' Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Also present was Cheryl Feist, Dawes County Clerk; Lindy Coleman, Assessor; Adam Edmund, Deputy County Attorney, Chris Fankhauser and Kerri Rempp. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by those present. Per LB 898 the Chairman announced the location of posted information concerning the Open Meetings Act. Copies of the Act are available upon request by anyone attending the meeting. Motion by Stewart, seconded by Swinney, approving the Agenda as presented. Roll call vote, Aves: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Minutes of the December 01, 2010 meeting were reviewed. Motion by Stewart, seconded by Swinney, approving minutes as published. Roll call vote, Ayes: Swinney, Johnson and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Board of Equalization Meetings will begin at 9:00 A.M. instead of 8:00 A.M. beginning January 2011. The Assessor presented tax correction #'s 4546-4551 for the Boards review and approval. Motion by Swinney, seconded by Stewart, directing the Chairman to sign the corrections. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 9:12 A.M. Gary Fisher and Mark Haynes met with the Board. Also present was Dave Connelly, Wayne Fisher, Jim O'Rourke, Mark Betson and Don Mandelko. Mr. Fisher reported he has been in contact with Mark Loos, Property Tax Liaison out of Scottsbluff. Mr. Fisher presented a map showing Market Areas 2 & 3 and sales thereof. He requested an increase in the buffer zones of these areas to create more uniformity. He also suggested a new Market Area be added. He reported sales from Market Area 3 aren't included on the Agriculture Land Roster and sell values need adjusted. He presented various graphs and explained that two County's have no home or building sites. It was learned that Property Tax Representatives argue 1031 exchanges have little or no impact on agricultural land values according to Fisher. Mr. Fisher indicated it is the responsibility of the Board of Equalization to direct the Assessor in implementing such changes to Market Areas. Mark Haynes suggested the County not consider sales containing less than 320 acres. The Board took no official action until such time they can meet with the Assessor.

There being no further business to be conducted by the Dawes County Board of Equalization a motion to adjourn at 9:44 A.M. was made by Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Swinney. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. The next Dawes County Board of Equalization will be on February 02, 2011 at 9:00 A.M. A current Agenda to the Board of Equalization proceedings is kept on file in the County Clerk's office during normal business hours for inspection, but the Agenda will close by 3:00 P.M. on January 28, 2011. The Agenda may be modified to include items of emergency nature. The meetings of the Dawes County Board of Equalization are open to the public.

#### **DAWES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS**

The Public convened meeting of the Dawes County Commissioners meeting in regular session was commenced at the hour of 9:45 A.M. on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of January 2011 in the Commissioner's room and published pursuant to public notice as required by law. The meeting was called to order by Commissioner Johnson. Roll was called and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioners' Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Also present was Cheryl Feist, Dawes County Clerk, Adam Edmund, Deputy County Attorney, Chris Fankhauser and Kerri Rempp. Per LB 898 the Chairman announced the location of posted information concerning the Open Meetings Act. Copies of the Act are available upon request by anyone attending the meeting. Motion by Stewart, seconded by Swinney, approving the Agenda. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Minutes of the December 16, 2010 meeting were reviewed. Motion by Stewart, seconded by Swinney, approving the minutes with the following corrections to wit: petibone, not petty bone and January 20<sup>th</sup> for Zoning Board Meeting, not January 10<sup>th</sup> as recorded. Roll call vote, Ayes: Swinney, Johnson and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Claims were reviewed. Motion by Stewart, seconded by Swinney, approving all claims as submitted. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 10:00 A.M. Public comment ensued with Dave Connelly expressing concern with the bridge on Bethel Loop Road. He reported a stringer is lying on the ground, approaches are washing out and he can't cross it with machinery or cattle. The Board informed Mr. Connelly this bridge is on the six year road plan. Wayne Fisher informed the Board he has been approached by Wayne Dryer informing him of proposed legislation to address prairie dog control measures. Commissioner Johnson indicated in its present format the language would need to be addressed prior to any official action by the Board. Roger Wess joined the meeting in progress. The following resolutions were adopted designating the 2011 Chairman, Vice Chairman, designated depositories, legal publications and Board appointments to the various agencies. Resolution No. 01-2011: Commissioner Swinney nominated Webb Johnson as Chairman, Commissioner Stewart seconded the nomination. Roll was called, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried, Resolution No. 02-2011; Commissioner Stewart nominated Commissioner Swinney as Vice Chairman but the motion died for a lack of a second. Discussion ensued. Mr. Swinney suggested Commissioner Stewart would be a better candidate for Vice Chairman as he lives right in Chadron and wouldn't have to travel in the event there was a bad snow storm. Motion by Commissioner Swinney, seconded by Johnson, nominating Commissioner Stewart as Vice Chairman. Roll was called, Ayes: Swinney, Johnson and Stewart, Nays: None. Motion carried. Resolution No. 03-2011: Motion by Stewart, seconded by Swinney, designating the First National Bank of Chadron, Bank of the West, Security First Bank in Crawford, First National Bank of North Platte and NPAIT as depositories for the year 2011, Roll was called, Ayes: Johnson, Stewart and Swinney, Navs: None, Motion carried, Resolution No. 04-2011; Motion by Swinney, seconded by Stewart, designating The Crawford Clipper of Crawford, Nebraska and The Chadron Record of

Chadron, Nebraska as the official legal publications for Dawes County for 2011. Roll was called, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. A letter received from Philip Curd, Dawes County Surveyor, was reviewed. Mr. Curd requested appointment as Dawes County Surveyor for the term beginning January 06, 2011. Motion by Swinney, seconded by Stewart, appointing Philip Curd as Dawes County Surveyor for the term beginning January 06, 2011. Roll call vote, Ayes: Swinney, Johnson and Stewart, Nays: None, Motion carried, Various Board appointments were made to wit: Motion by Stewart, seconded by Johnson, appointing Commissioner Swinney to the Airport Zoning Board. Roll call vote, Ayes: Swinney, Johnson and Stewart, Nays: None. Motion carried. Motion by Johnson, seconded by Stewart, appointing Commissioner Swinney to the Tourism Board. Roll was called, Ayes: Swinney, Johnson and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Motion by Stewart, seconded by Swinney, appointing Stewart to the Boards held by former Commissioner Blausey and Swinney to the remaining Boards held by former Commissioner Wess. Commissioner Johnson will retain all current Board appointments with the exception of the Tourism Board. Roll was called, Ayes: Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried. The Safety Committee Chairman position was discussed. Motion by Johnson, seconded by Stewart, appointing Commissioner Stewart as Safety Committee Chairman. Roll was called, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 10:30 A.M. Sandy Roes, WCHR Director, Roger Wess and Leah Grimm, Boys and Girls Club Director, met with the Board. Ms. Roes presented background information relevant to the Juvenile Justice Grant. The grant deadline is fast approaching. Discussion ensued. Commissioner Swinney asked about Crawford's involvement in the Boys and Girls Club activities. Leah Grimm elaborated on the current programs in place through the Boys and Girls Club. Grant funding would include Crawford. Ms. Roes informed those present the grant would apply to the entire Panhandle. Motion by Swinney, seconded by Stewart, to submit application for grant funding in the amount of \$8,222.00. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried. Ms. Roes then presented information relevant to the current County Aide Enhancement Grant. The new grant deadline is fast approaching. Discussion ensued. Motion by Stewart, seconded by Swinney, to submit application for grant funding in the amount of \$5,000.00 to \$10,000.00. Roll was called, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. A copy of both grant applications will be made available to all Board Members prior to official adoption.

At 11:07 A.M. Jay King, Custodian, approached the Board. He informed the Board that electrical outlets at 250 Main Street aren't grounded as required in commercial buildings. He presented an estimate from Robert's Electric in the amount of \$191.90 to fix the problem. Motion by Swinney, seconded by Stewart, approving the bid amount of \$191.90. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Discussion ensued regarding Mr. Kings hours of work. Mr. King indicated he feels 8:30-4:30 would be better hours as he could be here in the event something is needed. The Board agreed to try the new hours. No action was taken on the cell phone billing. The Board recessed at 11:25 A.M. and reconvened to regular session at 11:34 A.M.

At 11:35 A.M. Discussion ensued regarding temporary arrangements in the Roads Department. Also present was Martha Quay and Jeff Fankhauser. A motion was made by Commissioner Stewart to enter executive session at 11:44 A.M. to discuss personnel issues. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Swinney. Roll was called, Ayes: Swinney, Johnson and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Motion to reconvene to regular session at 12:33 P.M. was made by Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Swinney. Roll was called, Ayes: Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried. No action was taken during executive session. Motion by Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Swinney, to advertize for a Highway Superintendent. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. The advertisement will also be opened up to Engineering Professionals. Martha Quay's hours will temporarily change to 7:00 A.M. to 3:30 P.M. She will be responsible for coding Roads Department claims, submitting payroll, fielding calls received to Larry Hankins who in turn will contact the appropriate Commissioner to resolve any problems that arise. Anyone having concerns relevant to county roads can call (308) 432-0483 or (308) 430-3348. In other business Commissioner Johnson reported from November 01, 2010 to January 01, 2011 he recorded 133.5 hours in his capacity as Commissioner. Correspondences were received from the following individuals to wit: Lois Chizek re: thank you card; Tiny Bartlett re: displeasure with snow removal on Slim Buttes Road and Sequoia Consulting Group re: cost allocation proposal. No action was taken on the cost allocation proposal, however; a letter will be sent declining their services at this time. Commissioner Stewart reported only three (3) blades were available in District 1 to address snow removal on Slim Buttes Road, Board of Adjustment appointments ensued, Motion by Stewart, seconded by Swinney,

appointing Gary Fisher and Roger Wess to the Board of Adjustments re: Zoning. Roll was called, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. One Board appointment was made to the Zoning Board to wit: Motion by Commissioner Swinney, seconded by Stewart, appointing Bat Pourier to the Zoning Board. Roll was called, Ayes: Swinney, Johnson and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. The Zoning Administrator will notify appointees. Commissioner Johnson reported the Safety Committee has completed the building walk through inspection. He reported NIRMA has requested a copy of the Safety Committee Meetings be mailed to them. This is being requested to ensure all counties are conducting Safety Committee Meetings on a regular basis as required.

There being no further business before the Dawes County Board of Commissioners a motion to adjourn at 1:15 P.M. was made by Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Swinney. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried. The next regular meeting will be January 19, 2011 beginning at 9:00 A.M in the Commissioners room at the Courthouse. A current agenda for the meeting is kept on file in the County Clerk's office during normal business hours for inspection, but will close by 3:00 P.M. on Friday, January 14, 2011. The Agenda may be modified to include items of emergency nature. The meetings of the Dawes County Commissioners are open to the public.
