Also present was Cheryl Feist, Dawes County Clerk; Adam Edmund, Deputy County Attorney; Cheryl Dunn, Deputy Assessor and Chris Fankhauser, KCSR. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by those present. Per LB 898 the Chairman announced the location of posted information concerning the Open Meetings Act. Copies of the Act are available upon request by anyone attending the meeting. Motion by Johnson, seconded by Swinney, approving the Agenda. There being no discussion roll was called, Ayes: Johnson, Swinney and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Minutes of the April 02, 2014 meeting were reviewed. Motion by Commissioner Swinney, seconded by Johnson, approving the minutes as published. There being no discussion roll was called, Ayes: Swinney and Stewart and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Cheryl Dunn, Deputy Assessor, presented tax correction #'s 4868-4869 for the Boards review and approval. Kerri Rempp, The Chadron Record, Scott Littlejohn, GMC of Chadron and Barbara Sebesta, Treasurer, joined the meeting in progress. Upon review of the Board a motion was made by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Swinney, approving the corrections and directing the Chairman to sign such. There being no discussion roll was called, Ayes: Stewart, Johnson and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Barbara Sebesta presented 40 vehicle exemption renewals for Northwest Community Action; 1 vehicle exemption renewal for Bethlehem Lutheran Church; 1 vehicle exemption renewal for Camp Norwesca; 1 vehicle exemption renewal for First Congregational Church; 1 vehicle exemption renewal for First Baptist Church and 1 vehicle exemption renewal for Victory Heights Bible Camp. DAWES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Public convened meeting of the Dawes County Commissioners in regular session was commenced at the hour of 9:47 A.M. on the 7th day of May 2014 and published pursuant to public notice as required by law. The meeting was called to order by Commissioner Stewart. Roll was called and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioners Stewart, Johnson and Swinney. Also present was Cheryl Feist, Dawes County Clerk; Adam Edmund, Deputy County Attorney; Larry Hankin, Highway Superintendent; Ron Housh, NWRPPD; Kerri Rempp, The Chadron Record and Chris Fankhauser, KCSR. Per LB 898 the Chairman announced the location of posted information concerning the Open Meetings Act. Copies of the Act are available upon request by anyone attending the meeting. Motion by Commissioner Swinney, seconded by Johnson, deleting the website award and adding lawn care bids due to clerical error. There being no discussion roll was called, Ayes: Johnson, Swinney and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Minutes of the April 16, 2014 meeting were reviewed. Motion by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Swinney, correcting the minutes to read the meeting with Chadron State College, Commissioner Swinney and Lacy Peterson, HR Director was held at the Courthouse, not the College as recorded. There being no discussion roll was called, Ayes: Swinney, Stewart and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Claims were reviewed. Motion by Commissioner Swinney, seconded by Johnson, approving all claims with a change in the amount to claim #14050058 payable to Morford's Decorating. The amount paid to Morford's Decorating will be \$2086.50, not \$2334.00. There being no discussion roll was called, Ayes: Stewart, Johnson and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried. Correspondences received from DHHS re: incentive payment and NE. Commission Law Enforcement re: annual inspection of jail facility were reviewed and acknowledged by the Board. Public Comment ensued at 10:02 A.M. with Chris Fankhauser reporting the Travel Board has been awarded a \$2,163.00 grant which will be used to publish a booklet promoting Dawes County entitled "A place for all seasons". Commissioner Stewart reported representatives of Crow Butte Resources, Richard Taedter, Crawford Schools Superintendent and he met with Congressman Adrian Smith. Mr. Smith has agreed to assist with the NARC process. It was noted for the record that Governor Heineman has also offered his assistance.

At 10:04 A.M. Larry Hankin, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board. Also present was Scott Littlejohn of Chadron Motor Company. Three (3) bids were opened for the purchase of a ½ ton pickup 4x4 to wit:

Bid #1-Chadron Motor Company bid a 2014 Ram 1500 4x4 at a selling price of \$23,500.00 less trade-ins of a 1998 Chevrolet pickup at \$1500.00 and a 1999 Chevrolet pickup at \$2500.00 for a purchase price of \$19,500.00. The pickup bid has a 3 year-36,000 mile bumper to bumper warranty and a 5 year-100,000 mile power train warranty. **Bid #2**-Wahlstrom Ford bid a 2014 Ford F-150 4x4 at a selling price of \$23,585.40 less trade-ins of a 1998 Chevrolet pickup at \$1200.00 and a 1999 Chevrolet pickup at \$1800.00 for a purchase price of \$20,585.40. The pickup bid has a 3 year-36000 mile bumper to bumper warranty and additional warranty is available through the Ford Premium Care-5year-100,000 miles at a cost of \$1770.00 or the Ford Power Train warranty 5 year-100,000 miles at a cost of \$895.00. **Bid #3**-Wahlstrom Ford bid a 2014 Chevrolet Silverado 1500 at a selling price of \$26,995.00 less trade-ins of a 1998 Chevrolet pickup at \$3,000.00 and a 1999 Chevrolet pickup at \$3,000 for a purchase price of \$20,995.00. The pickup bid has a 3 year-36,000 mile bumper to bumper warranty. Also available is a 5 year-100,000 mile warranty at a cost of \$1815.00. Discussion ensued amongst the Board and Mr. Hankin. Commissioner Swinney moved to accept Chadron Motor Company's bid of \$19,500.00. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion. There being no discussion roll was called, Ayes: Johnson, Swinney and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. The pickup will be delivered the end of June or first part of July in 2014. The next order of business was a petition request submitted by Ron Housh of NWRPPD to run electrical lines across West Dakota Junction Road to the West Plains Grain facility. Motion by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Swinney, approving the petition request of NWRPPD to trench in electrical lines across West Dakota Junction Road to the West Plains Grain facility. There being no discussion roll was called, Ayes: Swinney, Stewart and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. At 10:30 A.M. three (3) semi-tractor bids were opened. Also present was Alex Dickman, Sheehan Mack. **Bid #1**-Sheehan Mack bid a 2010 Mack 613 with 271,179 miles, 445 H/P and a 197" wheel base. Selling price of \$63,000.00 less trade-in of a 1987 Freightliner at \$5,000.00 for purchase price of \$58,000.00. , Sheehan Mack also bid the following: a 2010 Mack 613 with 281,052 miles for a selling price of \$63,000.00 less trade-in of a 1985 Mack at \$5000.00 for a purchase price of \$58,000.00; a 2010 Mack 613 with 486,460 miles, 445 H/P, 10 speed automatic and a 201" wheel base. Selling price of \$63,000.00 less trade-in of a 1985 Mack at \$5,000.00 for a purchase price of \$58,000.00; a 2009 Mack 613 with 378,208 miles, 485 H/P, 15 speed automatic and a 180" wheel base. Selling price of \$63,000.00 less trade-in of a 1987 Freightliner at \$5,000.00 for a purchase price of \$58,000.00. **Bid #2** –Sahling Kenworth bid a 2007 International day cab with 482,933 miles, 400 H/P, 10 speed automatic and a wheel base of 169". Selling price of \$39,500.00 less trade-in of a 1985 Mack at \$2500.00 for a purchase price of \$37,000.00; also bid was a 2007 International day cab with 427,249 miles, 435 H/P, 10 speed automatic and a 171" wheel base. Selling price of \$41,500.00 less trade-

in of a 1987 Freightliner at \$2500.00 for a purchase price of \$39,000.00. **Bid #3**-Nebraska Truck & Equipment submitted a bid for a 2005 Mack 613 with mileage not meeting specifications at a selling price of \$32,500.00 less trade-in of a 1985 Mack at \$1500.00 for a purchase price of \$31,000.00 and a 2005 Mack 613 with mileage not meeting specifications at a selling price of \$23,500.00 less trade-in of a 1985 Mack at \$1500.00 for a purchase price of \$22,000.00. Commissioner Johnson moved to accept all bids received noting for the record the two bids received from Nebraska Truck & Equipment didn't meet bid specifications re: mileage. The Highway Superintendent was further directed to make a recommendation regarding the purchase of two semi-tractors at the May 21, 2014 Commissioner meeting. Commissioner Swinney seconded the motion. There being no discussion roll was called, Ayes: Stewart, Johnson and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried. Alex Dickman, Sheehan Mack, reported the Mack semi-tractors bid will have a better resale value than the other semi-tractor's bid. Road updates reported all three districts are blading, two (2) temporary seasonal truck drivers have been hired and are hauling rock to Slim Buttes Road from the State Pit. The State Pit has been reclaimed and the Crusher will move to the Dillon Pit. District 3 is doing bridge maintenance; the Sign Technician is doing bridge markers and will be applying for a grant re: object markers. The Bethel Loop project is complete except for fencing and the Bethel Loop South project will be addressed at the May 21, 2014 Commissioner meeting with Larry McCaslin. Lemmon and Schumacher bridges are scheduled for repairs and the Sand Creek Bridge project is scheduled to start May 12, 2014. Sioux County has requested a 3 ton weight limit on Sugarloaf Road. Dawes County's share of the project will cost \$56,000.00 according to Hankin. Red rock hauling by private contractors was discussed but no action taken as blading is priority at this time.

At 11:10 A.M. Shane Cullan, Weed Superintendent, met with the Board. Sixteen (16) bids were received for surplus property. All bids were opened and read aloud. Commissioner Swinney moved to accept all bids received. The Weed Superintendent was instructed to study the bids received and make a recommendation regarding bid awards at the May 21, 2014 Commissioner meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Johnson. There being no discussion roll was called, Ayes: Johnson, Swinney and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. A copy of what items were bid and the actual bids themselves can be viewed at the Clerk's Office during normal business hours after bids are awarded.

At 11:26 A.M. Alan Connell, VSO, met with the Board. He requested a county credit card as some hotels/motels are refusing to direct bill back to the county. The Clerk was instructed to contact the current card holder for Dawes County and set up an account for him. He also informed the Board that national accreditation will become mandatory for all Veteran Service Officers (VSO). Mr. Connell will obtain bids for a computer purchase and bring them to the May 21, 2014 Commissioner meeting. He will also budget for another computer in the 2014-2015 budget cycle.

At 11:39 A.M. Sandy Roes, WCHR Director, met with the Board. She reported the comprehensive juvenile justice plan is in the works. A planning date of May 16, 2014 in Bridgeport, NE. has been set. The Commissioners were invited to participate in the planning process. The 2011 Juvenile Justice grant in the amount of \$8,222.00 will be used to offer initial/advanced training re: SRO (School Resource Officer) personnel in Crawford and Chadron. The Crime Commission grant in the amount of \$24,675.00 which will be awarded fiscal year 2014-2015 will be used to pay the Crawford SRO. Discussion ensued regarding additional funding to help defray costs associated with insurance and retirement for the Crawford SRO.

At 11:55 A.M. Lacy Peterson, HR Director, met with the Board. She reported 13 applications have been filed for the Courtroom Bailiff positions. Interviews will be conducted in the near future. In other business the Board reviewed a surplus request from the Clerk's Office re: HP DeskJet printer that quit working. Commissioner Swinney moved to approve the surplus request with Commissioner Johnson seconding the motion. There being no discussion roll was called, Ayes: Swinney, Stewart and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Three (3) bids were received for lawn care services from mid May to the last week of October to wit:

Bid #1-Rischling Lawn Service-\$3975.00; **Bid #2**-Downs Rural Services-\$3225.00 and Pine Ridge Lawn & Garden-\$3885.00. All bids include mowing, weed-eating and fertilizer services. Commissioner Johnson moved to accept Downs Rural Services bid in the amount of \$3225.00. Commissioner Swinney seconded the motion. There being no discussion roll was called, Ayes: Stewart, Johnson and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried. Four bids were received for the purchase of a used county vehicle to wit:

Bid #1-Tommy's Car Lot-2006 Buick Lucerne CX with 69,983 miles at \$10,535.00 and a 2006 Buick Lucerne CXL with 91,000 miles at \$9,935.00. **Bid #2**-GMC Chadron-2012 Chevrolet Impala with 33,000 miles at \$13,999.00 and a 2007 Chevrolet Impala LTZ with 72,938 miles at \$11,999.00. **Bid #3**-Wahlstrom Ford-2012 Chrysler 200 with 9,000 miles at \$14,685.00 and **Bid #4**-Levi's Auto Salvage-2007 Buick Lucerne CX with 30,502 miles at \$10,700.00 (previously salvaged title). Discussion ensued amongst the Board members. County Officials had the opportunity to drive the vehicles and provide input. Motion by Commissioner Swinney, seconded by Johnson, accepting Tommy's Car Lot bid on the 2006 Buick Lucerne CX with 69,983 miles at \$10,535.00. There being no discussion roll was called, Ayes: Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried. All bid paperwork can be viewed during normal business hours at the Clerk's Office. The last order of business was reviewing and approving by general consent of the Board monthly fee/mileage reports of the various departments.

There being no further business to come before the Board the meeting was adjourned by the Chairman at 12:30 P.M. The next meeting of the Dawes County Commissioners will be May 21, 2014 beginning at 9:00 A.M. The meeting will be held in the Commissioners room at the Courthouse. A current agenda is available at the Clerk's Office during normal business hours but will close at 2:00 P.M. on May 16, 2014. The meetings of the Dawes County Commissioners are open to the public.
