The Public convened meeting of the Dawes County Board of Equalization in regular session was commenced at the hour of 9:00 A.M. on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2012 and published pursuant to public notice as required by law and or posted. The meeting was called to order by Commissioner Johnson. Roll was called and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioners Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Also present was Cheryl Feist, Dawes County Clerk; Lindy Coleman, Assessor and Adam Edmund, Dawes County Deputy Attorney. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by those present. Per LB 898 the Chairman announced the location of posted information concerning the Open Meetings Act. Copies of the Act are available upon request by anyone attending the meeting. Motion by Stewart, seconded by Swinney, approving the Agenda as presented. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Minutes of the May 02, 2012 meeting were reviewed. Motion by Swinney, seconded by Stewart, approving minutes as published. Roll call vote, Ayes: Swinney, Johnson and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Correspondences from TERC (Tax Equalization Review Commission) regarding TERC findings/orders on Dawes County Assessments and Chadron Apartments hearing order was discussed amongst the Board and County Assessor. The Assessor presented tax correction #4634-4636 and a 2012 tax correction for the Boards review and approval. Chris Fankhauser, KCSR Radio joined the meeting in progress. Upon review of the tax corrections a motion was made by Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Swinney, directing the Chairman to sign the tax corrections presented by the Assessor. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried. Barbara Sebesta, Dawes County Treasurer, presented four (4) vehicle exemption renewals from Northwest Community Action. Upon review a motion was made by Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Swinney, approving the four (4) vehicle exemption renewals of Northwest Community Action. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried.

There being no further business to be conducted by the Dawes County Board of Equalization the Chairman adjourned the meeting at 9:13 A.M. The next Dawes County Board of Equalization will be July 03, 2012 at 9:00 A.M. A current Agenda to the Board of Equalization proceedings is kept on file in the County Clerk's office during normal business hours for inspection, but the Agenda will close by 3:00 P.M. on Friday, June 29, 2012. ### DAWES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Public convened meeting of the Dawes County Commissioners in regular session was commenced at the hour of 9:14 A.M. on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2012 in the Commissioners room and published pursuant to public notice as required by law. The meeting was called to order by Commissioner Johnson. Roll was called and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioners Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Also present was Cheryl Feist, Dawes County Clerk; Adam Edmund, Dawes County Deputy County Attorney; Chris Fankhauser, KCSR and Scott Cotton. Per LB 898 the Chairman announced the location of posted information concerning the Open Meetings Act. Copies of the Act are available upon request by anyone attending the meeting. Motion by Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Swinney, approving the agenda. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Minutes of the May 23, 2012 meeting were reviewed. Motion by Commissioner Swinney, seconded by Stewart, approving the minutes with the following corrections to wit: Furman's Pit, not Herman's Pit and bottom dump trailers cost \$32,950.00 each, not \$31,272.00 each as recorded. Roll call vote, Ayes: Swinney Johnson and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Claims were reviewed. Motion by Stewart, seconded by Swinney, approving all claims. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried. Kerri Rempp, The Chadron Record joined the meeting in progress. Public Comment ensued with Scott Cotton informing the Board his budget proposal is ready. He will provide a copy of the proposal to Board Members at a later date. He also reported the Fairboard through grant funding has installed a new arena at the fairgrounds. The Board recessed at 9:52 A.M. and reconvened to regular session at 9:59 A.M.

At 10:00 A.M. Larry Hankin, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board. Two sealed bids were opened re: tractor purchase. **Henkens Equipment**-\$15,900.00 less trade allowance in the amount of \$2,000.00 on a 7030 Allis Chalmers for a net price of \$13,900.00 and **Horizon West, Inc.**-\$82,000.00 less trade allowance in the amount of \$2,000.00 on a 7030 Allis Chalmers for a net price of \$80,000.00. Bids received contained no information on what type of tractor was being offered. Motion by Stewart, seconded by Swinney, to accept both bids and directing the Highway Superintendent to obtain additional information from the Vendor's and make a recommendation to the Board. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Mr. Hankin reported RFP's (Request for Proposals) have gone out relevant to the Bethel Road bridge project. A pre-bid meeting will be held at the bridge site on June 14, 2012 beginning at 10:00 A.M. Updates included the following: District 1-Redfern Road shoulders are being pulled and gravel is going on the road; District 2-East River Road shoulders are being pulled and gravel is going on the road; District 3-West Ash Creek Road- shoulders are being pulled and gravel is going on the road. Blading is scheduled on major roads. Mr. Hankin conducted an ADT on Country Club Road for five (5) days. The average daily traffic count is low. The Board didn't take any action. The District 2 shop door and wall project is completed. Mr. Hankin reported the JD Motor Grader will be delivered on June 11, 2012. A surplus request was presented to the Board. Motion by Swinney, seconded by Stewart, approving the surplus request from the Roads Department. Roll call vote, Ayes: Swinney, Johnson and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Anyone wishing to view the surplus list can stop by the Clerk's Office during normal business hours. A petition request from Marty Tobiasson to trench across Shafer Road to install a water line to a tank was reviewed by the Board. Motion by Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Swinney, approving the petition request. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 10:35 A.M. Randy Horse, Country Kitchen, approached the Board. Mr. Horse informed the Board he plans to apply for a SDL (Special Designated Liquor License) and asked for the Boards approval. Mr. Horse informed the Board the SDL is for an August 25, 2012 wedding. Motion by Commissioner Swinney, seconded by Stewart, approving the SDL application request. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 10:45 A.M. Jay King, Custodian, approached the Board. Mr. King presented four (4) lawn mower proposals to wit: **Chadron Home Center**-6550.00; **Henkens Equipment**-\$13,850.00; **Power House Honda**-\$9477.00, \$10,757.00 & \$11,397.00; **RDO Equipment**-\$13,580.00; \$12,197.00; \$13,097.00;

\$12,851.00; \$12,509.00 & \$12,061.00. All bids included baggers. Discussion ensued. Motion by Swinney, seconded by Stewart, approving the purchase of a lawnmower and bagger from Chadron Home Center in the amount of \$6550.00. Roll call vote, Ayes: Swinney, Johnson and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. The County will keep the old lawn mower as a backup. Mr. King then reported to date fourteen (14) trees have been removed from the courtyard, with seven (7) of those trees recently removed by Tree Doc. Tree prices range from \$75.00-\$100.00 per tree depending upon what type of tree is purchased. The Board discussed various options but no decision will be made until budget time.

At 11:02 A.M. Nan Gould, Region 23 Emergency Manager, met with the Board. The LEOP (Local Emergency Operations Plan) is updated every five (5) years. Updates to the plan included adding NWRPPD (Northwest Rural Public Power District) to the contact list and review of Commissioner responsibilities. She reported a COOP (Continuity of Operations Plan) has also been drafted with Homeland Security grant money. The COOP expands on recovery, resumption and /or continuation of critical and essential processes to meet established RTOs (Recovery Time Objectives). Resolution No. 2012-11 was introduced by Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Swinney, accepting the LEOP updates. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 11:10 A.M. Mike Kohler, VSO (Veteran Service Officer) approached the Board. Mr. Kohler presented additional information on the VetrSpec software program. The State Department of Veterans Affairs utilizes the software program. The program allows hardcopy Veteran files to be entered electronically. Counties currently using the program include Sheridan, Box Butte, Banner and Scottsbluff. The software program costs \$399.00 per year for each user. Discussion ensued. The software program will be budgeted 2012/2013. In other business the Board moved the August 17, 2012 Commissioner meeting to August 16, 2012.

At 11:34 A.M. Lindy Coleman, Assessor, met with the Board. Motion by Commissioner Swinney, seconded by Stewart, appointing Lindy Coleman as Zoning/Floodplain Administrator for Dawes County. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Swinney and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. The Board took no action on a Zoning Board quorum change. The Board recessed at 11:40 A.M. and reconvened to regular session at 11:45 A.M. The 2012/2013 Bardon Insurance contract was reviewed by the Board. Motion by Stewart, seconded by Swinney, directing the Chairman of the Board to sign the contract. Roll call vote, Ayes: Swinney, Johnson and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. The PADD contract to update the Dawes County Comprehensive Plan was discussed. Motion by Stewart, seconded by Swinney, directing the Chairman to sign the contract with PADD to update the Dawes County Comprehensive Plan at a cost of \$9,000.00. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Stewart and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 11:59 A.M. Deb Cottier, NNDC, met with the Board. She reported in 1992 a revolving loan fund was established through CDBG grant money. The State of Nebraska is responsible for monitoring CDBG activities. The County received a letter dated May 04, 2012 informing them the use and administration of CDBG funds are subject to federal rules and regulations including but not limited to Environmental Review clearance, Davis Bacon wages, and low-to-moderate income job creation or retention. The letter went on to say to ensure that all CDBG funds are being used in accordance with CDBG requirements, the Department of Economic Development will be conducting a compliance monitoring review or the County could elect to return all unallocated funds and future payments on loans issued to the Department of Economic Development. Ms. Cottier reported the revolving loan fund has approximately \$350,000.00 out in loans. She went on to say she is confident that Dawes County has met all criteria relevant to the CDBG loan fund and is in compliance. She recommended the Board invite the Department of Economic Development to come and audit the program. She did caution the Board in the event for whatever reason the Department of Economic Development would not find the County in compliance the State will assume all loans/funds available through the revolving loan fund and the County couldn't apply for CDBG funding for two (2) years. Discussion ensued. The Board will invite the Department of Economic Development out to audit the program. Copies of the Department of Economic Development and Commissioner letters will be sent to the County's insurance carrier NIRMA.

At 12: 45 P.M. Pat Deaver, Interim Weed Superintendent, met with the Board. He reported spraying is in progress when the weather permits. Mr. Deaver shared work reports with the Board. He reported chemical inventory is in good shape and requested more hours to do the work involved. Due to

high winds and rain, Mr. Deaver isn't able to spray which puts him behind. If he had more hours he could spray when weather permits and work on other responsibilities when not spraying. Motion by Commissioner Swinney, seconded by Stewart, allowing up to ten (10) additional hours of work time per week and adjusting schedule when necessary. Roll call vote, Ayes: Swinney, Johnson and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Mr. Deaver will document any additional hours worked. The Board then reviewed two (2) Weed Superintendent applications and five (5) HR applications. The HR (Human Resource) position will be filled first. This will allow the new HR to sit in on the hiring process for the Weed Superintendent. The County Clerk will set up interviews for the HR and Weed Superintendent positions. The Board reviewed and approved monthly fee reports of the various offices.

There being no further business before the Dawes County Board of Commissioners the meeting adjourned at 1:40

P. M. The next meeting will be June 20, 2012 beginning at 9:00 A. M. The meeting will be held in the Commissioners room at the Courthouse. A current agenda for the meeting is kept on file in the County Clerk's office during normal business hours for inspection, but will close by 3:00 P.M. on Friday, June 15, 2012.
