DAWES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Public convened meeting of the Dawes County Commissioners meeting in regular session was commenced at the hour of 8:03 A.M. on the 16th day of June 2010 in the County Courtroom published pursuant to public notice as required by law. The meeting was called to order by Commissioner Johnson. Roll was called and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioners' Johnson, Wess and Blausey. Also present was Cheryl Feist, Dawes County Clerk. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by those present. Per LB 898 the Chairman announced the location of posted information concerning the Open Meetings Act. Copies of the Act are available upon request by anyone attending the meeting. Commissioner Wess asked his phone number be published so individuals having questions concerning Commissioner District 2 could contact him. That phone number is (308) 430-3953. Anne Hanson joined the meeting, Motion by Blausey, seconded by Wess, approving the Agenda and removing discussion of Board of Prisoners. Roll call vote, Ayes: Wess, Blausey and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Motion by Wess, seconded by Blausey, approving the June 01, 2010 minutes with the following notation to wit: the proposed grain handling facility will be located near Berea. Roll call vote, Ayes: Blausey, Johnson and Wess. Nays: None. Motion carried. Gail DeBuse-Potter joined the meeting. Claims were reviewed by the Board. Motion by Blausey, seconded by Wess, approving all claims as submitted, Roll was called, Aves: Johnson, Wess and Blausey, Navs: None, Motion carried, Correspondences included-NIRMA re: 2010/2011 Insurance billing; NACO re: Terrecom, LLC-free website auctions; Cassie Moore letter re: River Road conditions and notice of a grant award to Dawes County in the amount of One Hundred Eighty Thousand (\$180,000.00) from the Nebraska Department of Energy to replace courthouse windows. Resolution No. 2010-18 was introduced by Commissioner Wess, seconded by Commissioner Blausey, withdrawing previously adopted Resolution No. 2010-08 designating a recovery zone in the South portion of the N1/2 of the NW1/4 of Section 24, Township 33, Range 48, located in Dawes County, Nebraska as a recovery zone. Roll was called, Ayes: Wess, Blausey and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 8:30 A.M. Sandy Roes, WCHR Director, met with the Board. Per conditions of the County Aide Enhancement Grant a MOU (memorandum of understanding) was presented for the Boards review and implementation. Motion by Blausey, seconded by Wess, directing the Chairman to sign the MOU. Roll was called, Ayes: Blausey, Johnson and Wess. Nays: None. Motion carried. No one appeared for public comment so the Board used this time to discuss their intent to sale the property located at 408/410 Main Street. The County Clerk was instructed to contact NACO to find out the proper procedures for such action. The Board also used this time to review and approve monthly fee reports of the various offices.

At 8:53 A.M. Harvey Keim, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board. Also present was Jerry & Pat Moss; Sharon & Bob Goff; Carey Madsen; Steve & Suzan Hutchens; Stacy Swinney and Jake Stewart. Updates included the following: All roads equipment is now paid off with only one (1) payment being made to Caterpillar for a certified rebuild at 0% interest. Gravel hauling continues but water across some roads is making it difficult. The crusher crew is blading. A letter received from Cassie Moore was shared with Mr. Keim. Commissioner Wess indicated Squaw Mound Road has similar issues as River Road and suggested no windrows and more crown. Mr. Keim will visit with Road Crews. Pepper Creek project is scheduled for completion in October 2010. A petition request by Qwest to bore across Squaw Creek Road to install a telephone line was presented to the Board for approval. Motion by Blausey, seconded by Wess,

directing the Chairman to sign the petition request. Roll was called, Ayes: Johnson, Wess and Blausey. Nays: None. Motion carried. Kerri Rempp joined the meeting in progress. Stacy Swinney inquired as to when the graveling promised on Deadhorse Road was going to be done. He showed rock being used from the Montague pit and doesn't feel it's suitable for crushing. He suggested the Board look at costs involved to mine rock, crush it and haul as opposed to doing a trial run of red rock on the North two (2) miles of Deadhorse Road. Commissioner Blausey expressed concern with costs. Mr. Swinney indicated the biggest expense to haul red rock would be truck and fuel costs. Pat Moss expressed concern with drop offs on Deadhorse Road which creates a dangerous situation for people traveling the road. Stacy Swinney asked the Board to again consider looking at costs comparison. Sharon Goff expressed concern with rock coming from Roes pit as its very slick and a good base is needed. She asked the Board to consider the red rock suggestion. Commissioner Blausey indicated a good base is necessary for red rock to work and red rock is very expensive. Chad Franzen joined the meeting. The Board thanked those present for their input. Jody Applegarth joined the meeting in progress.

At 10:02 A.M. Marcus Tooze and two representatives from Enterprise GIS met with the Board. Also present was Becky Paulsen and Lindy Coleman. Mr. Tooze gave a presentation on Enterprise GIS which is an automated digital mapping, database and document management system. This program, already in place in the Assessor's office, helps combine other county databases together. The Weed and Road Departments are interested in linking their databases with the Assessor to assist in daily operations. Becky Paulsen also presented minutes of the previous Zoning Board Meeting and announced the next meeting which is scheduled for 7:00 PM at 250 Main Street on June 17, 2010. She reported the Alfalfa claim originally reported as a twenty (20) acre loss is in fact a two and one half (2.5) acre loss. The county will pay for the cost of three (3) acres and pay for a wheat crop to be planted this fall with Mr. Lambert receiving all proceeds from any potential harvest. In addition, once the county finds out the average financial yield per acre that Mr. Lambert receives from his existing alfalfa crop, the county will reimburse him.

At 10:21 A.M. Jody Applegarth met with the Board and stressed the importance of the public addressing concerns to their Elected Officials. He went on to say the corporate use of County Treasurers as collection agencies/puppets in special assessments against property owners is unconstitutional. He charged the Board with the responsibility of re-establishing equity, ethics and probity in government. Mr. Applegarth explained to the Board that he recycles everything and can account for it, however; he has continuously sought mitigation with SWANN without any success re: liens on his property. A grass roots movement is necessary to re-establish equity, ethics and probity in government according to Applegarth.

At 10:37 A.M a motion to enter executive session to discuss possible litigation was made by Commissioner Wess, seconded by Blausey. Roll was called, Ayes: Wess, Blausey and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Sheriff Dailey joined the executive session. At 11:22 A.M. a motion to reconvene to regular session was made by Commissioner Wess, seconded by Blausey. Roll was called, Ayes: Blausey, Johnson and Wess. Nays: None. Motion carried. No action was taken during executive session. Motion by Wess, seconded by Blausey, to grant back pay without interest in the amount of \$1264.20 to Sheriff Office employees to avoid costly litigation. Roll was called, Ayes: Johnson, Wess and Blausey. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 11:25 A.M. Erin Kuhn and Jane Schaneman, RCI (Regional Care, Inc.) Health Insurance met with the Board. Erin Kuhn presented the annual summary and specific reinsurance reports. Health premiums will go up thirty-four percent (34%) due to the reinsurance carrier paying out more than was collected in premiums last year. Overall, Dawes County has seen a sixty-two percent (62%) increase in health care premiums. The Board also acted on extending

dependant coverage instead of waiting until next year. In so doing this will eliminate the need for dependant coverage to be reinstated later and prevent a lapse in coverage for these individuals. Motion by Wess, seconded by Blausey, directing the Chairman to sign the early option. Roll was called, Ayes: Wess, Blausey and Johnson. Nays: None Motion carried In other business the Board adopted two resolutions granting budget authority to various offices for fiscal year 2009/2010. Resolution No. 2010-19 was introduced by Commissioner Wess, seconded by Johnson, granting budget authority to the Sheriff's Department in the amount of \$9,581.45; The Jail Facility in the amount of \$9,529.54; Dawes County Child Support Fund in the amount of \$1,221.16 and the County Relief Fund in the amount of \$3,603.00. Roll was called, Ayes: Johnson and Wess. Nays: Blausey. Motion carried. Resolution No. 2010-20 was introduced by Commissioner Wess, seconded by Blausey, granting budget authority to the Weed Department in the amount of \$17,819.99. Roll was called, Ayes: Wess, Blausey and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. At 12:30 P.M. the Board recessed. At 1:50 P.M. the Board reconvened. Commissioner Blausey had to leave the meeting in progress. Marshall Tofte, NIRMA, met with the Board to gather information about Dawes County for the July-August 2010 issue of The Interchange Magazine.

There being no further business before the Dawes County Board of Commissioners a motion to adjourn at 3:12 P.M. was made by Commissioner Wess, seconded by Johnson. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson and Wess. Nays: None. Motion carried. The next regular meeting will be July 07, 2010 beginning at 8:00 A.M. with a Board of Equalization meeting followed by a Commissioners meeting at approximately 8:20 A.M. Both meetings will be held in the Commissioners room at the Courthouse. A current agenda for the meeting(s) is kept on file in the County Clerk's office during normal business hours for inspection, but will close by 3:00 P.M. on the Friday preceding the meeting(s) on Wednesday. The Agenda may be modified to include items of emergency nature. The meetings of the Dawes County Commissioners are open to the public.
