June 18, 2014
DAWES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Public convened meeting of the Dawes County Commissioners in regular session was commenced at the hour of 9:12 A.M. on the 18th day of June 2014 and published pursuant to public notice as required by law. The meeting was called to order by Commissioner Stewart. Roll was called and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioners Stewart, Johnson and Swinney. Also present was Deb Lesmeister, Dawes County Deputy Clerk, Adam Edmund, Deputy County Attorney, and Vic Rivera. The Pledge of Allegiance was cited by those present. Per LB 898 the Chairman announced the location of posted information concerning the Open Meetings Act. Copies of the Act are available upon request by anyone attending the meeting. Motion by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Swinney, approving the agenda. Roll call. Ayes: Johnson, Swinney and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Kerri Remp, Chadron Record, entered the meeting. Motion by Swinney, seconded by Johnson approving the minutes of the June 4, 2014 with the following correction: replace word resided with recited. Roll call. Ayes: Swinney, Stewart and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Motion by Johnson, seconded by Swinney to approve the claims. Roll call. Ayes: Stewart, Johnson, and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried. Dawes County District Court submitted a surplus property listing. Motion by Johnson, seconded by Swinney to approve the surplus listing. Roll call. Ayes: Johnson, Swinney and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. The Board approved the payroll report. Commissioner Stewart read a letter from Highway Superintendent Larry Hankin addressing the safety concerns Dixie Lees had about the Bethel Road bridge located near Soesters when she appeared at the June 4, 2014 meeting. Correspondence from Region 23 was shared. Commissioner Stewart volunteered to attend the meeting concerning the Region 23 Multi-jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan on Tuesday, July 8, 2014 at 7:00 p.m. in Chadron, NE.

The budget agreement from Pete Peterson was read aloud. Motion by Johnson, seconded by Swinney to enter into the agreement with Mr. Peterson in the amount of \$1800.00 for the time frame from June 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015. Roll call. Ayes: Swinney, Stewart and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Roxie Graham-Marski, KCSR, entered the meeting at 9:50 a.m. The Law Enforcement Agreement with USDA, Forest Service was reviewed. Motion by Commissioner Swinney, seconded by Johnson to have Chairman Stewart sign the agreement. Roll call. Ayes: Stewart, Johnson and Swinney. Nays: None. Motion carried. Janice German entered the meeting.

At 9:53 A.M., Janice German, Dawes County Abstract approached the Board. She has been researching and compiling road records. She has maps on which she is documenting which roads have been vacated and which are minimal maintenance roads per Commissioner meetings. After discussion they may have Janice contact Dave Coe to get township maps with roads and highways on them and ask Philip Curd to assist Janice to get meets and bounds on descriptions on them for greater accuracy. Janice will meet with each Commissioner separately to go over the roads from the commissioner districts. They would also request that Larry Hankin, Highway Superintendent be present for these sessions. They will check with Mr. Hankin for a start date when he will be available. Janice German left the meeting at 10:20 A.M.

Public comment: No one appeared. Commissioner Swinney stated that during the Panhandle Public Health Meeting that he attended other Commissioners in the area also had concerns about the amount of money that WNCC receives from the local counties. At 10:00 the Board recessed and reconvened at 10:34 A.M.

Shane Cullan, Weed Superintendent met with the Board at 10:34 A.M. He shared with them that they had been spraying in the Whitney and Crawford area. He stated that the frequent rains and winds have somewhat hampered the spraying at times. He shared with the Board there is a website for applicators or beekeepers to register so they are aware of each other in the same area. Mr. Cullan used the example of an applicator being hired to spray and not being aware there were bees in the immediate area. Mr. Cullan left the meeting at 10:40 A.M. Gary and Cindy Sterling entered the meeting at 10:40 A.M.

Sandy Roes, WCHR, approached the Board at 10:41 A.M. The 2014 Crime Commission Grant focus has changed. It has changed from supporting a Crawford School resource officer to creating a social work position within the Chadron City Schools. The grant is for \$24,675.00. Motion by Johnson,

seconded by Swinney to move forward with the 2014 Crime Commission Grant. Roll call. Ayes: Johnson, Swinney and Stewart. Naves: None. Motion carried. Ms. Roes left the meeting at 10:55 A.M.

Public Comment was reopened to hear concerns of Gary and Cindy Sterling who approached the Board concerning the West Ash Creek Road which adjoins their property. Mr. Sterling stated that when the road department pulled the shoulders on that road the dirt was taken only from the west side ditch and none from the east side. The severe way in which the dirt was removed from that ditch has resulted in the fence starting to fall over from lack of support and major washing of the ditch. He also stated that the dirt removal was very close to a power pole. Mr. Sterling wanted to bring this to the attention of the Commissioners. Jerry and Cindy Sterling left the meeting at 10:55 A.M. Public comment was closed.

Expenditure reports were given to the Commissioners for their review. Motion by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Stewart to sign Resolution No. 10-2014 for budget authority. The resolution is to cover expenditures for Dawes County Zoning which is \$92.75 over budget and for Dawes County Sheriff who is \$5,366.80 over budget for a total of \$5,459.55. Roll call. Ayes: Swinney, Stewart and Johnson. Naves: None. Motion carried.

At 11:10 motion by Swinney, seconded by Johnson to go into executive session. Roll call. Ayes: Stewart, Johnson and Swinney. Naves: None. Motion carried.

At 11:30 motion by Johnson, seconded by Swinney to come out of executive session. Roll call. Ayes: Johnson, Swinney and Stewart. No action taken.

The Commissioners did their quarterly jail inspection.

There being no further business to come before the Board the meeting was adjourned by the Chairman at 12:52 P.M. The next meeting of the Dawes County Commissioners will be July 2, 2014 beginning at 9:00 A.M. with a Board of Equalization meeting followed by the Commissioner Meeting at approximately 9:20 A.M. Both meetings will be held in the Commissioners room at the Courthouse. A current agenda is available at the Clerk's Office during normal business hours but will close at 2:00 P.M. on June 27, 2014.
