Copies of the Act are available upon request by anyone attending the meeting. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by those present. Motion by Wess, seconded by Johnson, approving the Agenda as presented. Roll call vote, Ayes: Wess, Johnson and Blausey. Nays: None. Motion carried. Minutes of the November 04, 2009 meeting were reviewed. Motion by Johnson, seconded by Wess, approving minutes as published. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Blausey and Wess. Nays: None. Motion carried. Lindy Coleman presented tax correction #4429-4433 for the Board's review. Motion by Wess, seconded by Johnson, approving tax correction #'s 4429-4433 and directing the Chairman to sign them. Roll call vote, Ayes: Blausey, Wess and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried.

There being no further business to be conducted by the Dawes County Board of Equalization a motion to adjourn at 8:07A.M. was made by Commissioner Wess, seconded by Johnson. Roll call vote, Ayes: Wess, Johnson and Blausey. Nays: None. Motion carried. The next Dawes County Board of Equalization will be on January 06, 2010 at 8:00 A.M. DAWES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Public convened meeting of the Dawes County Commissioners meeting in regular session was commenced at the hour of 8:20 A.M. on the 2nd day of December, 2009 in the Commissioner Room and published pursuant to public notice as required by law. The meeting was called to order by Commissioner Blausey. Roll was called and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioners' Blausey, Wess and Johnson. Also present was Cheryl Feist, Dawes County Clerk. Per LB 898 the Chairman announced the location of posted information concerning the Open Meetings Act. Copies of the Act are available upon request by anyone attending the meeting. Commissioner Wess asked his phone number be published so individuals having questions concerning Commissioner District 2 could contact him. That phone number is (308) 430-3953. Motion by Wess, seconded by Johnson, amending the Agenda to include Resolution No. 2009-34 transferring funds from Inheritance Fund to the Dawes County Employee Insurance Account to meet medical claims, changing the time on public comment to 6:00 P.M. for a special roads meeting and correcting safety committee to read personnel committee under items for consideration. Roll call vote, Ayes: Wess, Johnson and Blausey. Nays: None. Motion carried. Motion by Johnson, seconded by Wess, approving the November 18, 2009 minutes with the following corrections to wit: the budgeted amount for overtime in the roads department was \$0, not \$1500.00; University of Nebraska, not University of Lincoln re: appointment of Chancellor. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Blausey and Wess. Nays: None. Motion carried. Claims were reviewed. Motion by Wess, seconded by Johnson, approving all claims as submitted. Roll call vote, Ayes: Blausey, Wess and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Chad Franzen, KCSR joined the meeting in progress. Correspondences included: Commissioner Blausey followed up with Alan Cisneros re: employment practices; Commissioner Blausey reported Stacy Swinney will be addressing the Board over a zoning concern; Megan Failla has been contracted to research the purchasing act relevant to mobile equipment; Senator Louden's office will be contacted re: language changes to the purchasing act; Becky Paulsen will meet with Butch Ellis re: conservation easement; Commissioner Wess reported Shari Wattley a CSC student will be interning Spring of 2010 to maintain the county website and announcement of County Government Day set for December 07, 2009. At 8:40 A.M. Stacy Swinney joined the meeting in progress. Mr. Swinney reported concerns with the Zoning Administrator not calling prior to coming to a worksite. Becky Paulsen and Harvey Keim joined the meeting in progress. Becky Paulsen introduced herself to Stacy Swinney and presented him with her business card should he have any zoning concerns in the future.

At 8:55 A.M. Becky Paulsen, Weed Superintendent, Zoning Administrator and Floodplain Manager met with the Board instead of her scheduled time at 11:15 A.M. She will be attending the NACO Conference. When she returns she will present annual reports to the Board. She recently was reviewed by Chris Burk and received a high rating for work done in the Weed

Department. The Forest Service Grant is completed with similar language as last years grant. She reported she will be receiving additional floodplain management training the spring of 2010.

At 9:00 A.M. Harvey Keim, Dawes County Road Superintendent approached the Board with updates. He presented the Certification of Highway Superintendent for January 01, 2009-December 31, 2009. Motion by Wess, seconded by Johnson, directing the Chairman to sign the certification. Roll call vote, Ayes: Wess, Johnson and Blausey. Nays: None. Motion carried. Road crews are smoothing roads. Kerri Rempp joined the meeting in progress. Mr. Keim read aloud a letter received from John Dinsley re: running electricity across Mill Road. Discussion ensued. The petition request attached to the letter will be considered at the December 16, 2009 meeting. Mr. Keim presented information requested by Commissioner Wess re: overtime costs paid out to Roads Employees. It would cost the county \$2420.60 for ten hours of overtime per roads employee. The Board will look at possibly changing the workweek for Roads Department Employees.

At 9:29 A.M. Sandy Roes, WHCR Director, met with the Board. She reported additional funding is being sought re: enhancement grant in the amount of \$2400.00 re: truancy training. She indicated she may need to ask for a carryover of this grant in June 2010. The proposed community center was discussed. Ms. Roes presented a detailed map with the proposed services to be offered. They include Dollar General, Boys and Girls Club, Chadron Public Library, Chamber of Commerce, Fitness Center and a drop-in Daycare. John Axtell joined the meeting in progress. Sandy Roes reported financing and sustainability is important to the success of the project. The Board was invited to be a part of the planning process. The site being looked at for the Community Center is the Eisenbarth building located on West 6th Street. In other business the Board opened discussion on Elected Officials salaries for fiscal years 2011-2014. The County Clerk informed the Board she has learned the resolution adopting said salaries must contain a percentage or dollar amount for salaries adopted. Previous figures agreed upon at the November 18, 2009 Commissioner meeting were withdrawn. Discussion ensued. The new figures presented by the Board and agreed upon by those Elected Officials present were: Elected Officials-\$38,783.32 in 2011 with a three percent (3%) increase for years 2012-2014. Public Defender will remain at $\frac{3}{4}$ time-\$43,631.00 in 2011 with three percent (3%) increase for years 2012-2014; County Attorney will become full-time-\$58,175.00 for 2011 with three percent (3%) increase for years 2012-2014 and the County Commissioners will receive fifty percent (50%) of the Elected Officials salaries resulting in a decrease for Board Members. Chief Deputies will remain at seventy-five percent (75%) of Elected Officials salary. The Board recessed at 10:55 A.M. The Board reconvened at 11:04 A.M. Commissioner Blausey read a letter aloud received from Sheriff Karl Dailey. The Sheriff's Department will continue to process Board of Prisoner reimbursements for the County. The Board will visit with the County Attorney regarding over-time paid out to Steve Crile upon his resignation. To date, insufficient documentation has been received to back what was paid in overtime to Mr. Crile.

At 11:10 A.M. Jay King, Custodian, met with the Board. He reported he has purchased a snow thrower to replace the snow blower that no longer works. Motion by Johnson, seconded by Wess, to surplus the snow blower. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Blausey and Wess. Nays: None. Motion carried. The snow blower will be exchanged for money owed on repairs.

At 11:15 A.M. Dave Coe met with the Board and presented updates on the proposed window project. He reported solicitation for the energy grant through Department of Energy begins December 03, 2009. Mr. Coe will present all necessary paperwork for the grant to the Department of Energy. He reported windows on the first and second floors of the Courthouse will be reduced in size and decorative rock will fill the space between suspended ceilings and existing

windows. He explained when the Courthouse was originally constructed the windows were set in frame and brick was laid up to the existing window. All this will be taken into consideration when Mr. Coe prepares the grant paperwork and RFP (request for proposals). A tentative timeline was presented to wit: February 03, 10, 17, 2010 advertise for RFP's; February 22, 2010 pre-bid meeting; March 04, 2010 open bids. Commissioner Blausey reminded Mr. Coe that \$100,000.00 has been budgeted for this project and must be used by the end of the current fiscal year. He also reminded Mr. Coe to stay in contact with the Sheriff's Department and Board of Corrections during the entire project. In other business the Board adopted Resolution No. 2009-34 transferring \$60,000.00 from the Inheritance Fund to the Dawes County Employee Insurance Account to cover medical claims until such time reserves are built up again. Motion by Wess, seconded by Johnson, adopting Resolution No. 2009-34. Roll call vote, Ayes: Blausey, Wess and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Commissioner Wess reported personnel policies are currently being reviewed. Monthly fee reports of the various offices were reviewed and approved by general consent of the Board. The Board recessed at 12:00 P.M. The Board reconvened at 1:05 P.M. Harvey Keim joined the meeting in progress. Discussion ensued re: Special Roads Meeting to be held tonight at Country Kitchen commencing at 6:00 P.M. The Board recessed at 3:02 P.M.

At 6:01 P.M. The Board reconvened in special session at the Country Kitchen for the purpose of hearing concerns, input and suggestions relevant to Dawes County Roads. Commissioner Blausey informed those present of the open meetings act which is followed at all meetings of the Board. He introduced Board Members Roger Wess and Webb Johnson, Highway Superintendent- Harvey Keim, Roads Foreman Jake Stewart, Crew Chiefs-Bill Gartner, Jay Bruns and Bart Dierksen. Crew Members present were Eugene Ducker and Bob Pickering. Also present was Cheryl Feist, Dawes County Clerk. Attendance ranged from approximately ninety-one (91) to one-hundred five (105) individuals for the special roads meeting. He commented the most important road in the county is the road you live on. He also asked everyone present to refrain from making personal attacks and to keep the focus on suggestions for improvements. Commissioner Blausey also addressed changes made since the November 04, 2009 Commissioner Meeting. They included crowning of roads, graders are out and visible, Squaw Creek has a new culvert and road work is done, the road signage project is completed with 1000 posts and 760 signs going in. The old signage will be removed in the near future. Whitney Lake Road was graveled, a road name signage project is in the works and snow removal policies and procedures were adopted. Copies of the snow removal policy were available to individuals at the sign-in table. Goals include funding two (2) part-time gravel truck drivers so graveling is done year-round, one (1) grader operator will be out in each of the three districts on a daily basis, additional grader training will be made available to those needing it, improve communications between Highway Superintendent and Roads Foreman, tack/appropriate responses to concerns will be addressed and monthly updates will be posted on the Dawes County Website. Other idea's included creating a sinking fund for future equipment purchases, creating paving districts, however; this would be at the cost of the taxpayer personally. He informed those present everyone needs to slow down on county roads. He's had reports of individuals driving eighty (80) miles per hour on county roads. He informed those present the one and Six Year Roads Hearing will be held on January 06, 2010 and invited everyone to attend. In addition, an invitation was extended to anyone interested in learning more about the budgeting process. He encouraged anyone having a concern to follow the proper chain of command. He then turned the meeting over to those present to hear concerns, complaints, input. An unidentified individual asked if the county has applied for ARIA funds. Commissioner Blausey reported these funds were available only for projects that were shovel ready. **Pat Moss**- First two (2) miles of Deadhorse Road is a huge safety concern and Nixon Road to Scofield's Drive west is all gumble when it rains and they can't get out. Gravel is needed. Commissioner Blausey read concerns presented by Tom Foster which included a gravel request from his driveway around the corner approximately one mile on West Ash Creek Road. **Bev McGannon**-Reported it's been one year since a grader has been

over Ferguson Road. There wasn't a grader after last snow storm and the road can't be used when it's bad so she has to use Old Hwy 20 to get anywhere. **Dan Rhembrandt**-He refuted the statement made by Commissioner Blausey that individuals are driving eighty (80) miles per hour on county roads. Bartlett and Stockade Roads are bladed flat. You can't fix potholes when you're carrying sod and grass. Graders need to slow down and pull to center of road. He suggested pinching crusher screen so rock coming out is smaller. He also expressed concern with the Board's bidding process and not contracting locally. He said there is too much focus on Slim Buttes Road and said no matter how crappy a blading job is roads employees still get paid. If he does a crappy job he doesn't get paid. **Gary Fickel**-N Belmont Road needs gravel. Two full rounds on roads are needed. **Duane Eleson**-Eleson Road is bad; no wings are being used on the road. He suggested flagging potholes to be filled. He has gravel available if needed. **Don Grein**-showed two rocks he found on Antelope Road. Commissioner Blausey reported there is 50,000 yards of gravel available to gravel roads. **Paul (inaudible)**-Lives on Breakneck Road. Suggested graveling mud holes. He expressed concern with never hearing back from the Highway Superintendent when he calls him. Commissioner Blausey reported it costs \$10,000.00 a mile for a contractor to deliver gravel and have the county spread it. **Lloyd Reed**-Lives on Squawcreek Road. Asked how many passes are made when blading roads? Jake Stewart replied three (3)-four (4) passes. Hough Road to Squaw Mound Road is bad. He suggested slowing down when removing snow. Commissioner Blausey reported Road Graders should be going 2.5 miles per hour when removing snow or blading. **Ron Lee**-Lives on Faulk Road. Today he hit a ridge in the road, rolled and totaled his \$30,000.00 pickup. He reported there are 6" potholes in Faulk Road and they need fixed. **Thorpe Thompson**-Rural individuals pay a tremendous amount of taxes and the county needs to start picking and choosing where tax dollars go. Hilltops don't have gravel, water was standing on N Whitney Road last spring, and some roads are lower than fields. Get the water off the roads. Potholes prevent individuals from going eighty (80) miles per hour. A good crown is necessary for water to drain off roads. Suggested packers be used on roads and he doesn't feel the roads department is prepared for a blizzard. **Patti Pourier**-Indicated people aren't expecting miracles, they just want safe roads. The roads were good in the past, what's happened? All roads are important to her, not just her road in response to a statement made earlier by Commissioner Blausey. She reported the first two miles of Deadhorse Road are dangerous and ditches are deep. **Jim McGannon**-Asked how many miles of road are in District 3? Jake Stewart responded approximately 270 miles. He reported roads department previously used to disc weeds, where are they now? Jake Stewart replied there are two (2) discs available. His family has lived on Faulk Road since 1954 and its always been bad. **Jerry Schumacher**-Lives on Goffena Road. He thanked the roads department members and Board for hosting this special meeting. He suggested a map be included with the snow removal policy/procedures pamphlet showing school routes since they are listed as a priority. He suggested the Board revisit the school routes as a priority. Goffena Road needs gravel. Commissioner Blausey reported heavier equipment is crossing over county roads than in the past. The way things were done in the past is antiquated. A tremendous amount of tax dollars are spent in the court systems. He reported traffic counts are available to anyone requesting them. Commissioner Wess presented a map showing the school routes and invited those present to look at it after the meeting. **Bat Pourier**-Indicated he feels sad it takes a meeting like this to fix a problem. He believes in logic and keeping things simple. Slim Buttes and Beaver Valley Road have butte rock and they're good. He reported Jake Stewart did a great job on Deadhorse Road but it changed when he stopped doing the road. He asked why the roads department consolidated. He told Mr. Keim if he were Harvey he'd been out on the roads the day after the 11-04-2009 Commissioner Meeting. If everybody does their part it will work. People need to be held accountable. He asked if work done on the roads is inspected. He supports the local economy but questioned why we used an outside contractor to haul gravel? No one has addressed policies/procedures, are there any? Commissioner Blausey reported the county went to one department to eliminate a dysfunctional roads department and have a Highway Superintendent. Harvey Keim reported an outside contractor was used because he was already in the area where gravel need hauled. Job

responsibilities are available for all roads department employees. Everyone was invited to attend the budgeting process. Patti Pourier requested the roads budget be put on the website. She is also concerned Deadhorse isn't a priority road due to no school route. Roger Wess presented a copy of the manual used by the roads department and informed those present a copy can be obtained from the Department of Transportation. He also reported there is a county manual issued to all new employees. **Celeste Lee**-Lives on Faulk Road. She told the Board to not use the criminal system as an excuse for a crappy job on roads. She doesn't expect miracles but wants a job well done. **Russ Finneman**-Reported he was a Road Foreman for twelve years but quit when the county went to one roads department. In District two there was always gravel available and blading roads was priority. An unidentified individual reported they never see a grader in Whitney area. Commissioner Blausey reported schedule changes will be looked at so the roads department can deal with issues when they occur and no one has to wait over the weekend. Another unidentified individual said there is manpower available to be trained to run equipment and assist the county in clearing roads. Another unidentified individual asked about snow removal policies. Another unidentified individual asked how the One and Six Year Road Plan gets prioritized. Harvey Keim explained the protocol used in planning the One and Six Year Road Plan. The same individual also asked how a road neglected for fifty years gets prioritized and wants ditches on Cottonwood Road. Commissioner Wess responded one year projects are being addressed. Another unidentified individual reported they make calls to Highway Superintendent but never receives a call back. **Stacy Swinney**-Reported the One Year Plan contains general maintenance on county roads. He agrees Slim Buttes Road should be paved but not at the expense of the taxpayers. Maintenance should be priority with graveling and grading. The current roads setup will work given time. He went on to explain to those present why the roads went to one department. Construction projects cost money. Crushed rock must pass a 3/4" screening. He feels the county should do away with the crusher as the majority of other counties have done. He suggested rotating crews to meet demand and double shift crews in snow storms. Bridges need replaced when needed, not one bridge replacement every eight years. Commissioner Blausey asked John Madsen when the Belmont Bridge was done. He reported in 2004. Russ Finneman added another bridge replacement was done around the same time. **Randy Schommer**-Would like to see a dump truck following maintainers with gravel to fill potholes. He suggested using a different type of rock on county roads. Railroad tracks have good rock that possibly could be crushed. **Casey Schuhmacher**-Lives on Whitney Lake Road. He asked who's liable if someone goes over a bridge with a load limit and it's the only available route. Commissioner Blausey indicated if someone knowingly uses a bridge with a load over the bridge load limit, they would be responsible. He also requested minimum maintenance roads have some maintenance as they're heavily used. He left everyone with the statement, "It's not what's said, it's what's done that's important". **BJ Drinkwalter**-Lives on Raben Road. You could boat around in the water on the road. The bridge on Raben Road has planks going bad and nails are coming out. Old Hwy 20 is used as an alternate route but it's bad too. There are washboards two inches apart. He asked why put signs 30' apart and why are we paying a County Commissioner when complaints are referred to the Road Superintendent? **Tom Sellman**-Lives on Table Road. He suggested the 50,000 yards of gravel in storage needs to be stored on the county roads. Potholes need fixed. Gary Fickel asked if the county is working with the Forest Service on graveling projects. Harvey Keim responded they have projects in place with the Forest Service. **Dillion Lesmeister**-Lives on Alpha Road and drives Slim Buttes Road daily. He asked if potholes on railroad tracks can be fixed. Commissioner Blausey responded the railroad is the only entity that can fix those potholes as it would create a huge liability for the county. Mr. Lesmeister suggested the roads department find out what Sheridan County, Nebraska and Shannon County, South Dakota do with their road maintenance. **Deb Lesmeister**-Lives on Slim Buttes Road. She asked who should be called to find out if a road has been plowed after snow storms. Commissioner Blausey indicated she could call him, Harvey Keim or Jake Stewart. She expressed concern with not getting an answer back from the Highway Superintendent. Jake Stewart indicated she could call him and he would find out for her. **Jasmine Catellier**-Lives on Alpha Road. She reported there are huge potholes on

her road including the railroad tracks and it has a huge impact on individuals being transported in emergency situations. **Geneice Walters**-Lives on Squaw Mound Road. She suggested grading middle of the road to get ruts out. River Road from Squaw Mound Road West needs graveled. In addition, Cemetery Road needs work. Commissioner Blausey thanked everyone present for their input and suggested Casey Schuhmacher pretty much summed it up with his statement earlier, "It's not what's said, it's what's done that's important". An unidentified individual asked for a timeline concerning road changes. Commissioner Blausey responded by saying he couldn't give any specific dates but all suggestions, input, etc. would be considered when changes are implemented.

There being no further business before the Dawes County Board of Commissioners a motion to adjourn at 9:20 P.M. was made by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Wess. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Blausey and Wess. Nays: None. Motion carried. The next regular meeting will be December 16 , 2009 beginning at 8:00 A.M. in the Commissioners Room at the Courthouse. A current agenda for the meeting is kept on file in the County Clerks office during normal business hours for inspection, but the Agenda will close by 4:00 P.M. on the Friday preceding the Board meeting on Wednesday. The Agenda may be modified to include items of emergency nature.
