The meeting was called to order by Commissioner Rivera. Roll was called and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioners Rivera, Johnson and Stewart. Per LB 898, Commissioner Rivera announced the location of posted information concerning the Open Meetings Act. Copies of the Act are available upon request by anyone attending the meeting. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by those present. Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson, moved to approve the Agenda. Roll call vote, Aves: Johnson, Stewart and Rivera, Navs: None, Motion carried. Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson moved to approve the January 28, 2020 Commissioner Meeting minutes as published. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Rivera and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Claims were reviewed. Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Stewart, moved to approve all claims as submitted. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera, Johnson and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. There being no correspondence the Board reviewed and approved by general consent the monthly fee/mileage reports of the various departments. The Board reviewed a grant request from Chadron Festival of Quilts in the amount of \$1405.22. Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson, approving the Tourism Board Grant to Chadron Festival of Quilts in the amount of \$1405.22. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Stewart and Rivera. Nays: None. At 9:43 A.M. Brad Streeks, Custodian, presented a quote from KONE to replace a PC Board in the Jail elevator at a cost of \$1639.00. Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson, moved to approve the KONE quote to replace a PC Board in the amount of \$1639.00. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Rivera and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 9:48 A.M. Lindy Coleman, Assessor, met with the Board to discuss going back to our old dental plan as it has better coverage than the current plan. The Board will take this under consideration at renewal in May, 2020. There was no one for Public Comment.

At 9:52 A.M. Larry Hankin, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board. Surplus items were discussed as to disposal/selling once the Highway Superintendent presents a surplus request. Mr. Hankin reported the 1983 140G and another piece of equipment could be used as trade-in(s). Mr. Hankin will check with the City of Chadron about any up-coming surplus auctions. Red rock hauling and available haulers was discussed. Location and current supply of red rock was also discussed. Mr. Hankin presented a 2020 Road Construction schedule with emphasis on pulling shoulders. Also discussed at length was establishment of a road construction crew. The crew would consist of four (4) road department employees. Commissioner Rivera suggested Mr. Hankin meet with Crew Chiefs to decide who will be on the road construction crew.
