DAWES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Public convened meeting of the Dawes County Commissioners in regular session commenced at the hour of 9:21 A.M. on the 11th day of October, 2022 pursuant to public notice as required by law. The meeting was called to order by Chairman, Vic Rivera. Board Members present were Jake Stewart and Webb Johnson. Also present was Adam Edmund, Deputy County Attorney, Cheryl Feist, Dawes County Clerk and Wade Yada, Highway Superintendent. Per LB 898, Commissioner Rivera announced the location of the Open Meetings Act located on the door by the United States Flag. Copies of the Act are available upon request. Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Commissioner Stewart, moved to approve the agenda with the removal of the opioid resolution and Applegarth lien update. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Johnson and Rivera. Nays: None. Motion carried. Minutes of the September 27, 2022 meeting were reviewed. Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson, moved to approve the minutes as recorded with the following correction to wit: MSHA, not OSHA as recorded. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Rivera and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Correspondence acknowledged by the Board included a letter received from NIRMA. Claims were reviewed. Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson, moved to pay all claims as presented. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera, Stewart and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 9:29 A.M. Wade Yada, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board. Road Updates include general maintenance fixing blow outs and grading roads. Mr. Yada also reported there is one (1) month left at the Goff pit, then onto the Bruns pit, followed by the Wohler's pit. Mike Reynoldson will be helping in Road District 1 due to a crew member leaving. The Board informed Mr. Yada to use Mr. Reynoldson where needed. The new trailer is here, evaluations are currently being conducted and will be finished next month. All crew members received MSHA training except the new crew member coming on board. He reported there is 1709 gallons of fuel left on the contract. Commissioner Rivera talked to Doug Mader. The CDL school is very expensive. He wanted to visit with someone about the costs associated with the CDL classes but no one would return call. The US Senate has a bill to reduce costs associated with CDL classes. Commissioner Rivera will continue to look into the CDL issue. In other business the Board reviewed and approved by general consent all monthly fee reports of the various departments. A tourism grant was reviewed by the Board. Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson, moved to approve a grant in the amount of \$1087.50 for Festival of Quilts. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Johnson and Rivera. Nays: None. Motion carried. Commissioner Johnson reported he has found an individual interested in his replacement on the Zoning Board. Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Rivera, moved to appoint Larry "Skeet" Rising to the Zoning Board to represent District 3. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Rivera and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 10:05 A.M. Don Brush met with the Board. He informed the Board he is interested in fulfilling the term of Philip Curd, Surveyor. Commissioner Stewart asked about rates. Re-establishment of corners is done differently in counties according to Brush. The Board reviewed his bid and the bid received from M.C. Schaff & Associates. Discussion ensued. Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Stewart, to appoint Don Brush with Panhandle Landy Surveying to fulfill the term of Philip Curd, Surveyor. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera, Stewart and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 10:29 A.M. Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Stewart, moved to enter executive session regarding a legal matter. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson and Rivera. Nays: Stewart. Motion carried. At 10:43 A.M. motion to reconvene to regular session with no action taken during executive session was made by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Rivera. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera and Johnson. Nays: Stewart. Motion carried.

There being no further business before the Board the meeting was adjourned at 10:45 A.M. The next meeting of the Dawes County Commissioners will be held on October 25, 2022 beginning at 9:00 A.M. The meeting will be held in the Commissioner Room. The agenda will close at noon on October 20, 2022. **All Resolutions adopted by the Dawes County Board of Commissioners are available for public inspection during normal business hours of the County Clerk's Office.**

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Vic Rivera. Roll was called and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioner Rivera; Commissioner Jake Stewart and Commissioner Webb L. Johnson. Also present was Cheryl Feist, Dawes County Clerk; Lindy Coleman, Assessor; Wade Yada, Highway Superintendent and Adam Edmund, Deputy County Attorney. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by those present. Per LB 898 the Chairman announced the location of posted information concerning the Open Meetings Act. The poster can be found on the door next to the United States Flag. Copies of the Act are available upon request by anyone attending the meeting or requesting a copy. Motion by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Stewart accepting the agenda as presented. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Johnson and Rivera. Nays: None. Motion carried. Motion by Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson to accept the minutes of the September 13, 2022 meeting as published. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Rivera and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Correspondence acknowledged by the Board included TERC filings. Ms. Coleman presented tax correction #'s 5242 - 5243 for the Boards review. Upon review of said tax corrections, Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Stewart, moved to approve tax correction #'s 5242-5243 as presented and directed the Chairman to sign such. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera, Stewart and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 9:05 A.M. Sam Wellnitz, Treasurer, presented an application for vehicle exemption on a 2012 Ford Cargo Van for NCAP (Northwest Community Action Program). Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson, moved to approve said application for vehicle exemption. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Johnson and Rivera. Nays: None. Motion carried. In other business the Board adopted Resolution No. 2022-18 setting the 2022-2023 levy for various political subdivisions.
