DAWES COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION

The Public convened meeting of the Dawes County Board of Equalization in regular session was commenced at the hour of 9:00 A.M. on the 27th day of December, 2022 and published pursuant to public notice as required by law and or posted. Due to blizzard conditions the Board did not meet on December 13, 2022 so minutes of the November 07, 2022 meeting will be ratified at today's meeting. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Vic Rivera. Roll was called and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioner Rivera; Commissioner Jake Stewart and Commissioner Webb L. Johnson. Also present was Cheryl Feist, Dawes County Clerk; Lindy Coleman, Assessor and Wade Yada, Highway Superintendent. Adam Edmund, Deputy County Attorney was excused from the meeting. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by those present. Per LB 898 the Chairman announced the location of posted information concerning the Open Meetings Act. The poster can be found on the door next to the United States Flag. Copies of the Act are available upon request by anyone attending the meeting or requesting a copy. Motion by Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson accepting the agenda as presented. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Johnson and Rivera. Nays: None. Motion carried. Motion by Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson to accept the minutes of the November 07, 2022 meeting as published. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Rivera and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Lindy Coleman, Assessor, presented tax correction #'s 5244-5249 for the Boards review. Upon review of said tax correction(s) Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Commissioner Stewart, moved to approve tax correction #'s 5244-5249 as presented and directed the Chairman to sign such. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera, Stewart and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. The Assessor then presented Chadron Community Hospitals application request for tax exempt status on several parcels. The Assessor reported two (2) parcels, identified as 230005793 and 230006622 use has changed to house paramedics and on-call staff so she recommended approval, however; the remaining parcels she didn't recommend approval. Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson, moved to approve exempt status re: parcel ID #'s 230005793 and 230006622 but not the remaining parcels per Assessor recommendation. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Johnson and Rivera. Nays: None. Motion carried.

There being no further business to be conducted by the Dawes County Board of Equalization, the Chairman adjourned the meeting at 9:15 A.M. The next meeting will be held on January 10, 2023 at 9:00 A.M. A current Agenda to the Board of Equalization proceedings is kept on file in the County Clerk's office during normal business hours for inspection, but the agenda will close by 12:00 P.M. on Thursday, January 05, 2023. The agenda may be modified to include items of emergency nature. The meetings of the Dawes County Board of Equalization are open to the public. DAWES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Public convened meeting of the Dawes County Commissioners in regular session commenced at the hour of 9:16 A.M. on the 27th day of December, 2022 pursuant to public notice as required by law. The meeting was called to order by Chairman, Vic Rivera. Board Members present were Jake Stewart and Webb Johnson. Also present was Cheryl Feist, Dawes County Clerk, Wade Yada, Highway Superintendent and Kay Hill, Human Resources Director. Adam Edmund, Deputy County Attorney was excused. Per LB 898, Commissioner Rivera announced the location of the Open Meetings Act located on the door by the United States Flag. Copies of the Act are available upon request. Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Commissioner Johnson, moved to approve the agenda with following changes to wit: change the date on Agenda to 12-13-2022 re: claims ratification, not 11-13-2022 as recorded. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Johnson and Rivera. Nays: None. Motion carried. Due to blizzard conditions on December 13, 2022 the Board did not meet so a motion was made by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Stewart, to approve the November 22, 2022 minutes with the following correction to wit: Mike Bateman, not Larry Burbach, was in attendance at the November 22, 2022 meeting. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Rivera and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Claims were reviewed. Due to blizzard conditions on December 13, 2022 the Board wishes to ratify claims for the December 13, 2022 meeting to wit: Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson, moved to approve all claims with the exception of Claim #s 221200806 in the total amount of \$1798.47 and Claim # 22120157 in the total amount of \$1295.11 both payable to River A Holdings. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera, Stewart and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried. Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Stewart, moved to approve claim 's 22120157 in the amount of \$1295.11 and claim #221200806 in the amount of \$1798.47 both payable to River A Holdings. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart and Johnson with Rivera abstaining from the vote. Nays: None. Motion carried. The Board reviewed claims for today's meeting. Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson, moved to approve all claims as presented with the exception of Claim #'s 22120039 in the total amount of \$1135.96 and claim # 22120062 in the total amount of \$7592.93 both payable to River A Holdings. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Rivera and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Stewart, moved to approve Claim #'s 22120039 in the total amount of \$1135.96 and claim # 22120062 in the total amount of \$7592.93 both payable to River A Holdings. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart and Johnson with Rivera abstaining from the vote. Nays: None. Motion carried. Kay Hill, Human Resource Director, dropped off performance appraisal forms to Board members.

At 9:30 A.M. Wade Yada, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board. He reported crews are still digging out individuals and opening county roads from the blizzard. The following updates were shared with the Board re: roads to wit: District 1-Eagan, Slim Buttes, East Table, McHenry and Trinkle Roads are open with at least one lane. District 2-West Ash, Grantham and Dry Creek Roads are open. Country Club and section line have access to all residents from one direction or the other with the middle still impassable. Table is closed from west McGannon to Highland Road but open from District 2 shop to Hwy 385. Buttermilk, Kings Canyon, Mann and Norwesca still remain closed. District 3-E. Bethel Loop is closed, Dodd south of Moody is closed and residents south on Deadman have at least one lane open. Lemmon, Breakneck, N. Whitney Lake roads are now open. Faulk will be open for residents tonight. Mr. Yada took this opportunity to thank his crew members for all the hours they have committed to helping fellow citizens and getting county roads open. He also went on to say he appreciates the patience of the public in getting county roads and individuals dug out. Equipment repairs will be necessary in all three (3) districts to wit: District 1-Grader down, oil leak and the 936F starter went out. District 2-2 blades broke down, however; one will be coming back to shop today. District 3-V Plow broke but there is a spare available. All equipment repairs will be addressed as time allows. Fuller Construction has been contracted for two (2) loaders to help open county roads. The Board discussed dozer locations. The Roads Department will need to address policy re: emergency call-ins of crew members during the blizzard. The Board recessed at 9:55 A.M. and reconvened to regular session at 10:00 A.M.

At 10:00 A.M. Karl Dailey, Sheriff, met with the Board re: Crawford Law Enforcement contract. Mr. Dailey suggested the Board look at an hourly contract for Officers or no contract with Crawford for Law Enforcement services. Several factors will need to be considered if the contract is dissolved.

At 10:24 A.M. Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Commissioner Stewart, to enter executive session with NIRMA re: legal matter via teleconference call. Roll call vote, Ayes: Johnson, Rivera and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried. At 10:50 A.M. Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Johnson, moved to reconvene with no action taken during executive session. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera, Stewart and Johnson. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 10:55 A.M. Lindy Coleman, Assessor, met with the Board. She shared a letter received from AS Land Deal Holdings to purchase her property in Dawes County. She expressed concern because the letter she received contained old data and no data sales were ever requested. In speaking to the State, she learned this firm isn't located at the return address in Florida. She feels this is a scam and doesn't want individuals taken advantage of. The State recommended the letter be turned over to the County Attorney for review. The Board agreed with Ms. Coleman. The Assessor will remit the letter to the County Attorney.

At 11:00 A.M. Ron Pelton, Aaron Tenney and Larry Rising, Whitney Irrigation Board Members met with the Board. Also present was Joni Jespersion, Mobius Communications and Kyndal Tenney. Joni Jespersion indicated she has been working with Whitney Irrigation District on grants to fund necessary repairs needed at Whitney Irrigation District. Ron Pelton then spoke to the Board. Whitney Irrigation District was created per Nebraska State Statute. The district impacts the community through taxes collected, recreational opportunities and economic stimulus. He went on to explain there are two (2) emergency situations that need addressed immediately. The Cottonwood pipeline is separating and leaking. Pricing of PVC pipe has increased dramatically since COVID. This pipeline services fourteen (14) patrons and supports 40% of the irrigated grounds. The Head Gate is old and manually operated. Moss causes flooding so the head gate needs manually flushed. Electronic gates would eliminate flooding. The inlet drifts shut and causes flooding as well so the district wants to install a pipeline. Projected start date for the projects is October 01, 2023 with a finish date of April 01, 2024. The district requested ARPA funds for the grant match. The Board will review what's available through the ARPA funds and make a decision at the January 10, 2023 Commissioner Meeting. In other business the Board reviewed and approved by general consent all fee/monthly mileage reports of the various departments. The Board conducted a quarterly jail inspection.

There being no further business before the Board the meeting was adjourned at 12:07 P.M. The next meeting of the Dawes County Commissioners will be held on January 10, 2023 beginning at 9:00 A.M. with a Board of Equalization meeting followed by the Commissioner meeting at approximately 9:20 A.M. Both meetings will be held in the Commissioner Room. The agenda will close at noon on January 05, 2023. **All Resolutions adopted by the Dawes County Board of Commissioners are available for public inspection during normal business hours of the County Clerk's Office.**
